



## A Letter from Our President

Dear Generous and Loyal Donors,

We are pleased to share our annual report on activities implemented by PEP, our partners in Bangladesh, in 2022 which were funded by PSDI donors. The difference you have made in the lives of the 13,620 families touched is immeasurable. We've shared three graphs to summarize the key points that capture our performance. As you can see, while we feel somewhat short of our 2021 Revenue level, we continue to reduce our expenses to send PEP the most funding possible.

Our fundraising goal for 2023 is \$400,000. We feel this is within reach and are hopeful that with your continued generous support and more contributions from our grantees and new sources of revenue that we will be able to celebrate a year where we meet - and hopefully exceed - our goal.

This year has gotten off to a very good start. For the last two years we have benefited from two grants from the Pulte Family Foundation. This past February our PEP partners hosted Pulte representatives who wanted to see first-hand what their donations were accomplishing. The Pulte reps were so impressed with their visit and the onsite evidence of how the poor have been helped by their recent grants that they committed a significant increase in funding for this year! And, we have received individual donations from several members of their group as well. We couldn't be happier with the result of their visit and are very grateful to our PEP partners for their excellent preparation for and hospitality provided during the Pulte visit.

We have also benefited from recent grants from the Norbert H. Hardner Foundation facilitated by Board Member Jeff Basler. Jeff has done an excellent job in cultivating this new funding source and we are grateful for his efforts.

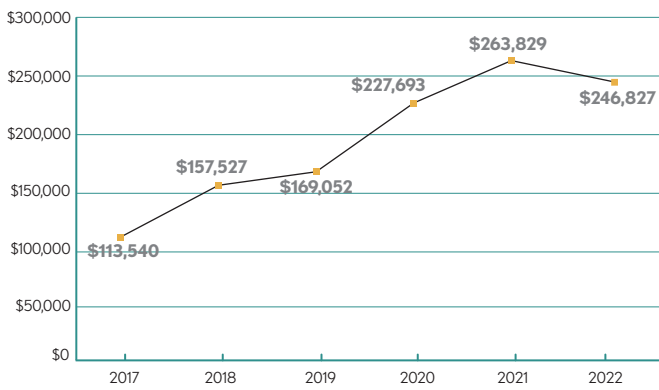

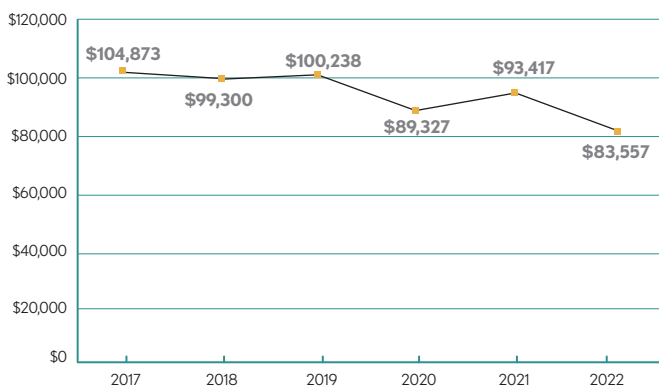

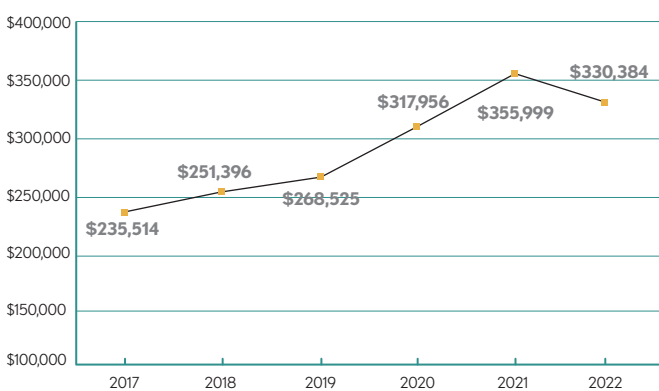
### Money Sent to PEP

# OUR YEAR BY THE NUMBERS

13,620 families were touched by our important work in Bangladesh.



## BASIC NEEDS

- 1,668** people received emergency food support
- 87** children received clothing
- 5** family's huts were repaired
- 43** children living on the streets of Dhaka received a daily meal



## EDUCATION

- 194** children attended their 1st year of primary school
- 1,020** children attended their 2nd year of primary school
- 11** children were helped with education materials to continue their education

## HEALTH

- 5,166** people participated in 434 health issue meetings
- 2,350** patients treated via the Integrated Health Care Program in Kishoreganj
- 1,728** patients were treated at the T. Ahmad Clinic in Netrokona
- 89** individuals received free testing & treatment via the Poor Fund established for the T. Ahmad Clinic
- 10** street children in Dhaka received medical treatment

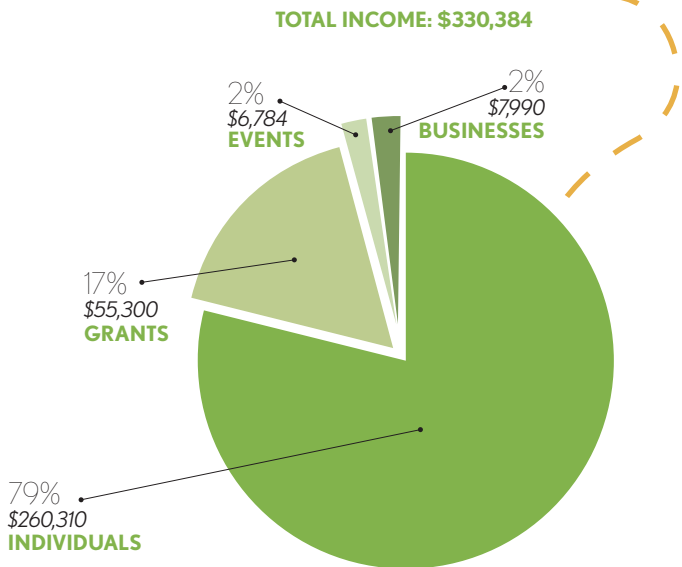
## INCOME GENERATING ACTIVITIES

- 1,619** families received fruit and timber tree saplings
- 116** women-led families were empowered through income generating activities
- 96** families received small grants for income generating activities including small businesses, cottage industries, and land leases for agriculture use
- 14** families received livestock to raise

## OTHER

- 589** families impacted by severe flooding were served with all aspects of the holistic model to aid their recovery
- 50** social workers continue to support and encourage families they serve
